

Curriculum Requirements for Apprenticeships

20:42:07:07. Apprentice curriculum in cosmetology.

Each cosmetology apprentice during the course of training must receive minimum hours of training in the branches of cosmetology, divided between practical and theory hours as follows:

1. Safety and sanitation procedures to include hygiene, hazards, disorders, and diseases: 150 hours;
2. Scientific concepts to include chemistry, bacteriology, anatomy, and physiology: 300 hours;
3. Hair coloring to include tinting, bleaching, highlighting, and tipping: 375 hours;
4. Chemical hair relaxing: 60 hours;
5. Haircuts: 475 hours;
6. Hairstyling, wave shaping, thermal curling, pincurling, shampooing, wigs, braiding, and scalp treatments, including demonstrations: 500 hours;
7. Permanent waving: 250 hours;
8. Nail technology to include manicuring, pedicuring, artificial nails, and related services: 250 hours;
9. Massage manipulations to include scalp, head, neck, hands, arms, feet and legs: 30 hours;
10. Esthetics to include facials, facial machines, body treatments, makeup application, hair removal, and eyebrow arching: 350 hours;
11. Cosmetology laws and board rulings: 25 hours; and
12. Business practices to include salon management, booth management, salesmanship and ethics: 60 hours.

A minimum of 350 hours of the curriculum set forth in this section shall be in theory classes. In addition to the hours set forth in this section, each apprentice must receive an additional 175 hours of training. The additional hours shall be in the areas that the senior instructor deems necessary to supplement the basic course requirements for an individual apprentice.

20:42:07:07.01. Apprentice curriculum in nail care.

Each nail technology apprentice during the course of training must receive the following minimum hours of training in the branches of nail technology:

1. Safety and sanitation procedures to include hygiene, hazards, disorders, and diseases: 75 hours;
2. Scientific concepts to include chemistry, bacteriology, anatomy, and physiology: 150 hours;
3. Manicure, pedicure, and hand, lower arm, feet, and lower leg massage manipulations: 200 hours;
4. Artificial nails to include sculptured nails, nail tips, nail wraps, and gel nails: 340 hours;
5. Electric files or appliances: 20 hours;
6. Cosmetology laws and board rulings: 20 hours; and
7. Business practices to include salon management, booth management, salesmanship and ethics: 60 hours;

A minimum of 200 hours of the curriculum set forth in this section shall be in theory classes. In addition to the hours set forth in this section, each apprentice must receive an additional 35 hours of training. The additional hours shall be in areas that the senior instructor deems necessary to supplement the basic course requirements for an individual apprentice.
