New Business

Role of the Commission was given by James Marsh, Labor and Management Division Director. The Human Rights Office is responsible to investigate potential violations of South Dakota's discrimination laws. Ray Falk, Human Rights Investigator conducts investigations as a Department of Labor and Regulation (DLR) employee located at the Kneip Building, and Ann Hajek from Sioux Falls performs investigations on a contract basis.

James Marsh gave an overview of the 2011 Program Report on Human Rights. Potential discrimination claims has the most significant activity at 288 phone calls, letters or emails. Intakes 158, requests for information 182, claims opened 88, claims closed 85, Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) referrals 22.
