RE: Application for Insurance Producer License

Dear Mr. Randle,

This letter is to notify you that your application for licensure as a nonresident insurance producer in South Dakota has been denied. The reason for the denial is as follows:

You submitted an application for an individual nonresident insurance producer license to the South Dakota Division of Insurance ("Division") on June 7, 2019. On your answers to the application questions, you answered "Yes" to questions concerning misdemeanor and felony convictions, judgements withheld or deferred, or current charges. You provided documentation with your application of your misdemeanor and felony charges.

The Division wrote to you on June 19, 2019 to request a written statement regarding the charges and why you believe you should be licensed in South Dakota. After receiving no response, the Division wrote to you on July 18, 2019 making the same request. After receiving no response to the July 18 letter, the Division contacted you on August 20, 2019 via the telephone numbers listed within your application. To date, the Division has not received a response.

Based on the above information, your application is denied based upon SDCL §§ 58-30-167(1) and (2) for providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete, or materially untrue information in a license application and violating the insurance laws or rules of the State of South Dakota and/or another state.

Please note that this denial is considered an administrative action which will be reported to the database maintained by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. If an administrative action occurs, an insurance producer may be required to report the action to any and all states in which an insurance license is held and in accordance with the timeframes and requirements of each state.

Pursuant to SDCL § 58-30-168, you may make a written request to the Division of Insurance within thirty (30) days of the date of this denial for a hearing to determine the reasonableness of this decision to deny your application for licensure.
