RE: Application Denial for TPA Registration

To whom it may concern,

This letter is to notify you that your company's application for registration as a Third-Party Administrator ("TPA") in South Dakota has been denied. The reason for the denial is as follows:

International Benefit Administrators, LLC ("IBA") submitted an application for a TPA registration to the South Dakota Division of Insurance ("Division") on March 28, 2022. IBA failed to supply any of the required documentation with their application. On April 14, 2022, the Division wrote to IBA asking for an explanation regarding the deficient application. On May 4, 2022, IBA responded, but still did not supply all the required documentation. Thus, On May 12, 2022, the Division again wrote to IBA asking for the missing documentation. Having failed to receive a response, on June 28, 2022, the Division sent IBA a cite letter for failing to timely respond and again asking for the missing documentation. On July 18, 2022, IBA finally responded, but still failed to provide the updated information. Thus, on July 19, 2022, the Division again requested the needed information. On July 27, 2022, IBA finally provided all of the information that was requested. After reviewing the information, it was discovered that IBA withheld information from the Division. Thus, on August 17, 2022, the Division wrote IBA asking for an explanation. On August 26, 2022, IBA provided the withheld information stating they were no longer providing services for the provider they left off in their previous responses.



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IBA has continuously adjudicated claims in South Dakota without proper licensure. Additional, IBA has been the subject of at least 11 prior investigation files with the Division:

- 1000055 IBA failed to file annual report in South Dakota. Fined \$250.
- 1000914 IBA failed to report Wisconsin 2012 action to the Division. Received a Warning Letter.
- 1002466 IBA failed to report Louisiana 2013 action to the Division. License became inactive and no response had been received.
- 1004917 IBA acted as a an unlicensed TPA from 2014 to 2016. Fined \$20,000.
- 1007626 IBA applied for a business entity license. On the application it was found that IBA failed to disclose administrative actions, and processed claims without proper licensure. License was granted. Fined \$30,000.
- 1007990 IBA was part of multiple complaint due to delays in claim payments. It was found that IBA again processed claims without licensure. File was referred for market conduct exam.
- 1008987 IBA failed to respond to several complaint investigations. IBA did respond to the cite letter. License denied. Complaint files:
 - 1008990 IBA failed to respond to a complaint investigation.
 - o 1010013 IBA failed to respond to a complaint investigation.
 - o 1010350 IBA failed to respond to a complaint investigation.
 - o 1010435 IBA failed to respond to a complaint investigation.

Based on the above information, your company's TPA registration application is denied based upon SDCL 58-12-20, 58-29D-24, 58-29D-31(2) & (4), 58-30-167(1), (2) & (8), and 58-33-66, for using methods or practices in the conduct of its business which render its further transaction of business in this state hazardous or injurious to insured persons or the public including previously failing to timely settle/pay claims; violating any lawful rule or order of the director or any provision of the insurance laws of this state; using fraudulent, coercive, or dishonest practices, or demonstrating incompetence, untrustworthiness, or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business in this state or elsewhere; and failing to respond to an inquiry from or failing to supply documents requested by the Division within twenty days of receipt of such inquiry or request.

Please note that this denial is considered an administrative action which will be reported to the database maintained by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. If an administrative action occurs, an insurance producer may be required to report the action to any and all states in which an insurance license is held and in accordance with the timeframes and requirements of each state.



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You may make a written request to the Division of Insurance within thirty (30) days of the date of this denial for a hearing to determine the reasonableness of this decision to deny your application for licensure.
