

The Labor Market Information Center (LMIC) is a part of the South Dakota Department of Labor and Regulation. Our purpose is to collect, analyze and provide public information on the labor market of the state. We possess expertise in workforce data and analysis. Among those who use our information are businesses, economic development groups, public agencies, career decision makers, employment specialists, and education and training program planners.

LMIC is South Dakota's representative for federal-state cooperative programs with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, which gives us the opportunity to be familiar with labor market information for the nation and other states. We also have staff well versed in demographic and economic information from other national agencies, such as the U.S. Census Bureau.
