#### **Booths & Salons:**

#### Q: How do I open a new booth or salon?

A: In order to establish a new booth or salon please complete the 'Salon/Booth Permit License Application': <a href="https://dlr.sd.gov/cosmetology/forms/Salon Booth Permit Application f.pdf">https://dlr.sd.gov/cosmetology/forms/Salon Booth Permit Application f.pdf</a>. The Fee is \$60.00

#### Q: What should I put as my opening date?

A: The Commission will issue your license with an active date which reflects your 'opening date'. If you are not sure when you will be open because your salon or booth is under construction, you are making renovations, or you are negotiating a lease, please include a date that accounts for this timeline. You must include an opening date on your application for it to be processed.

#### Q: How long is my temporary salon/booth permit valid for?

You have 90 days from the date your permit is issued to be inspected. If you have not completed construction or renovation, or if you have not signed a lease, you will not be inspected. If an inspector attempts to inspect your booth or salon and they are denied entry or are unable to conduct the inspection, you are subject to a reinspection fee.

Salon or booth permits will not be extended unless there is an error or delay on the part of the Commission

#### Q: Do I have to put what days I am closed?

A: You are required to indicate which days your booth or salon will be closed. This information allows the Commission inspectors to schedule unannounced inspections. If your salon or booth is closed at a time when you have indicated it is open, you are subject to a reinspection fee.

#### Q: Do I need to apply for a booth or salon license?

A: This is an individual decision based on the preferences and needs of the business owner. However, a booth is required to be registered under an existing salon license. A salon license is required for each unique postal address.

Note: If you are a W-2 employee of a salon and receive a wage from the salon, you are not required to hold a booth license.

#### Q: What are the basic requirements to open a salon/booth?

#### A: You must have:

- A minimum of 120 sq ft of working space for the first licensee (does not include restroom or storage closets)
- A minimum of 60 sq ft for each additional licensee
- Plumbing connected to a municipal sewer system
- Adequate ventilation for the square footage of the salon or booth
- Publicly accessible restroom
- Relevant supplies (e.g. labeled containers for soiled/clean items, disinfectant, clean linens)
- A minimum of one covered waste container (to be emptied at least daily)
- Sink
- First aid kit (at least one per salon)
- 5-pond ABC Fire Extinguisher (at least one per salon and one for every 1500 sq. ft.)

### License Specific Requirements:

#### Nail Salons/Booths:

- Mechanical exhaust system (must vent to open air) or activated carbon filtration adequate for square footage
- Minimum of one nail table with lamp
- Minimum of one manicure chair
- Minimum of one pedicure station with client chair
- A nail applicator brush

#### Esthetics Salons/Booths:

- A minimum of one facial chair
- One additional chair
- Clean and disinfected esthetics tools & Implements

#### Cosmetology Salons:

- A minimum of one shampoo bowl
- Clean and disinfected cosmetology tools & Implements
- All other required items for nail technology, esthetics, or both as applicable.

Note: this list is not exhaustive, please refer to the South Dakota Cosmetology Commission Laws & Rules (SDCL 36-15; ARSD 20:42)

#### Q: What will the inspectors look for during my inspection?

Q: I am building or starting a new salon, how do I know if it will pass inspection?

A: In addition to carefully reading the South Dakota Cosmetology Commission Laws & Rules, you may request a pre-inspection for a fee of \$50.00.

If you would like to request a pre-inspection, please complete the "Payment Identification Form", and mail it to the Commission with a check or money order. Please mark the 'Other' box and write 'Pre-inspection': https://dlr.sd.gov/cosmetology/forms/Payment Identification Form.pdf

#### **Education:**

#### Q: Where can I go to school?

#### Q: What school does the Commission recommend?

A: The Commission does not endorse any school or college.

#### Q: When can I take the State board examination?

A: Students with an active enrollment status at a Commission approved school or college may take the State board examination at any time. However, we strongly encourage students to complete at least 50 percent of their education before attempting the State board examination.

#### **Examinations:**

Q: I have graduated and have a job lined up; can I work while I wait to be scheduled for the State board examination?

A: Recently graduated students may apply for a temporary license to practice their relevant trade. Temporary licenses are valid until the next scheduled examination, and become immediately invalid should an examinee fail to pass the State board examination.

#### Q: When are examinations held?

A: With certain exceptions, examinations are held every 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month. Examination dates are subject to change at the Commission's discretion.

#### Q: Where are examinations held?

A: State board examinations are held in Pierre, South Dakota at the Commission office located at 217 W. Missouri Ave.

#### Q: When will I know when I am scheduled to take the examination?

Examination applicants will be sent an admission notice two weeks prior to the exam. You must bring with you your valid, state issued photo ID, US passport, or Military Common Access Card.

If you have a temporary license, you must bring this with you in order to be admitted to the exam.

#### Q: When will I receive my exam results and my license?

A: Examinees will be emailed their pass/fail status within 24 hours of their examination.

#### Q: What if I pass?

A: If an examinee passes the exam, he or she will be sent a temporary work authorization and his or her license will arrive in the mail within 10 days.

#### Q: What if I fail?

A: If an examinee fails the exam, he or she will be provided with a score report and a retake application.

Examinees who fail the exam three times will be required to wait three months before taking the exam again. Examinees who fail six times will require Commission approval to attempt the examination for a seventh time.

#### **Inspections:**

### Q: What will the inspector look for?

### Q: What happens if I fail inspection?

A: You will receive one of two forms if you fail an inspection:

Blue Form: A blue form is issued for a minor infraction including, but not limited to, missing
items such as a fire extinguisher or first aid kit. It may also be issued if you have a recently
expired license.

You are required to submit the blue form along with proof of correction to the Commission.

Yellow Form: A yellow form is issued if the licensee fails inspection due to multiple infractions
or one or more serious infractions. Serious infractions include, but are not limited to,
employing unlicensed workers, not possessing a salon or booth license, possessing a
chronically expired or long overdue license, or performing services which require additional
certification without proper certification.

If you receive a yellow form, a reinspection is required, and you are subject to a \$50.00 reinspection fee. Two or more failed inspections are grounds for disciplinary action. Please mail in the form with a check or money order for \$50.00

#### Q: How often will I be inspected?

A: Established salons and booths will be inspected annually at a minimum.

#### **Licensing:**

#### Q: What licenses are offered under the South Dakota Cosmetology Commission?

A: The South Dakota Cosmetology Commission offers three licenses, Cosmetology, Esthetics, and Nail technology. Cosmetologists may practice all services covered by the three licenses.

#### Q: How many education hours are required for each license?

A: Cosmetologists must earn 1500 Commission approved education hours. Estheticians must earn 600 Commission approved education hours. Nail Technicians must earn 400 Commission approved education hours.

#### Q: Can I perform eyelash extension, microdermabrasion, or electric nail files?

A: A licensee may perform the above services if it is within their scope of practice and they have received proper certification.

#### Q: How to I get certified to perform eyelash extension, microdermabrasion, or electric nail files?

A: In order to become certified you must do the following:

- Eyelash extension:
  - Complete 16 hours of approved coursework/training
  - Submit proof of completion to include a certificate with the number of hours and course title.
- Microdermabrasion:
  - Complete 16 hours of approved coursework/training
  - Submit proof of completion to include a certificate with the number of hours and course title.
- Electric Nail Files:
  - Complete 8 hours of approved coursework/training
  - Submit proof of completion to include a certificate with the number of hours and course title.

If you choose to use a course provider that is not pre-approved by the Commission, you will be required to pay \$35.00 so the Commission can research the provider and verify the course. **Providers and courses not on the pre-approved list are not guaranteed to be approved.** 

A \$5.00 duplicate license fee is required for issuance of an updated license. Please send a check or money order along with your proof of course completion.

#### **Reciprocity Licensing:**

### Q: I am moving to South Dakota, how can I transfer my license?

A: If you hold an active Cosmetology, Esthetics, or Nail Technology license in good standing in another state, you may be eligible to receive a reciprocity license in South Dakota. In order to apply for reciprocity licensure you will need to complete the following:

- Submit the online Reciprocity Application:

- 2. Request that the state which issued your license send the SD Cosmetology Commission a 'Certification of Licensure'. The certification will need to include details about the amount of education you received, whether or not you have taken and passed a state approved theory examination, whether or not your license is active and in good standing, whether you have ever received disciplinary action, and when your initial license was issued.
- 3. Request that your school send the Commission an official transcript (optional strongly encouraged)

Many states have different names for their Cosmetology, Esthetics, and Nail technology licenses so do not be discouraged if your license does not have the same name as one in South Dakota. If you meet the basic requirements for licensure in South Dakota it is likely that you are eligible for a reciprocity license.

#### Q: How long does the process take?

A: Once the Cosmetology Commission has received your application and <u>all required documents</u> it can take up to 15 business days for the Cosmetology Commission to review your application and issue your license (if you qualify).

#### Q: Will I have to take an exam?

A: All applicants for reciprocity licensure are required to take the 25 question, take-home 'State Laws & Rules' examination. If you have not taken a state approved theory examination for your specific license type, you will be required to take the South Dakota State Board Examination.

#### Q: Can I work while my application is being processed?

A: Applicants for reciprocity licensure may apply for a temporary license: https://dlr.sd.gov/cosmetology/forms/exam and temp license application.pdf.

Once the Commission has received a complete application and a certification of licensure showing that the applicant meets the minimum requirements for licensure, the Commission will issue the temporary license.

Temporary licenses are good for 30 days, or until the next scheduled state board examination if the applicant is required to take the exam.

### Q: What if my license type does not match a license in South Dakota?

A: Each application is reviewed individually to determine equivalency with a relevant South Dakota license.

The license types available in South Dakota are Cosmetology, Esthetics, and Nail Technology. Please <u>click here</u> to see the hours requirements for each license type.

If your license is determined not to be equivalent to a South Dakota license, you may need to earn additional education hours.
