

SKIN CARE – SAFETY AND SANITATION

1. All procedures must be non-invasive. Non-invasive means confined to the nonliving cells of the stratum corneum of the epidermis.
2. The physical area must be clean, sanitary and safe.
3. Sufficient light and ventilation must be provided.
4. Sufficient electrical outlets must be available.
5. 5-pound ABC fire extinguisher must be easily accessible.
6. First aid kit with blood spill procedure must be easily accessible. Blood spill must be followed if there is a blood spill.
7. Covered waste receptacle must be easily accessible and emptied at least once a day.
8. Disinfecting agents must be available in the working area for immediate use at all times
9. Disinfecting agents must stop bactericidal, virucidal, and fungicidal activity, and indicate on its label that it is registered with the Environmental Protection Agency as effective for its intended use.
10. Each item of equipment used on a patron must be clean and sanitary at the time of use.
11. Clean, sanitized equipment must be stored in a clean, closed receptacle.
12. Soiled or used items must be kept in a separate, closed, labeled container to prevent its reuse until cleaned.
13. Sufficient towels so that a clean and sanitary towel is used on each patron.
14. Only clean capes, towels, blankets, sheets, or linens may be used on clients.
15. Separate closed receptacles for clean and soiled towels or linens.
16. A closed receptacle for the disinfection of steel instruments used in the shop.
17. Wet and dry sanitizers to immerse all the working licensees' instruments.
18. Single-use articles such as cosmetic sponges must be disposed of immediately after use in a closed waste receptacle.
19. Multi-use articles must (first) be washed in soap and water and then disinfected. After being disinfected the multi-use articles must be stored in clean, closed containers between use.
20. Any multi-use article, tool or product which cannot be cleaned and disinfected is prohibited.
21. Electrical equipment must be disinfected by removing foreign matter and applying a disinfectant.
22. Disinfected electrical and nonelectrical equipment must be stored in separate, clean, closed receptacles.
23. All fluids, semifluids, creams, and powders must be kept in clean, closed, and labeled containers and dispersed with a disinfected spatula, shaker, pump, or spray dispenser.
24. All fluids, semifluids, creams and powders must be dispensed correctly with a disinfected spatula, shaker, pump or spray dispenser.
25. NO cross-contamination of products.
26. Harmful supplies must be stored in a cabinet or area that is not accessible to the public.
27. Hands must be washed just prior to performing procedures on a client.
28. Hands must be washed again if hands get contaminated during a procedure.
29. Use of disposable latex or hypo-allergenic gloves by the licensee are encouraged.

30. The license of each person must be displayed in the working area.
31. Any continuing education certificates must be displayed in the working area.
32. Each licensee must wear clean clothing and footwear.
33. Before doing microdermabrasion, 16 hours of continuing education must be completed and approved by the commission.
34. Chemical exfoliation – see rules for which chemicals may be used.
35. Chemicals containing bichloroacetic acid (BCA) or any acid that requires a prescription cannot be used on living tissue.
