Dear Mr. Anderson,

This letter is to notify you that your application for licensure as a non-resident insurance producer in South Dakota has been denied. The reason for the denial is as follows:

You submitted an application for an individual nonresident insurance producer license on July 25, 2013. Your application indicated that you were not involved in any prior administrative actions. However, the Division's investigation revealed you were subject to an administrative action in the state of North Carolina in 2011. The Division contacted you requesting an explanation regarding the incorrect information provided in the license application at the mailing address listed on your application, 1321 Mount Kisco Drive, Charlotte, NC 28213. You did not respond to the Division's letter.

Therefore, your application is denied based upon SDCL 58-30-167 (1) and (2) for providing incorrect, misleading, or incomplete information in your application.

Please note that this denial is considered an administrative action which will be reported to the data base maintained by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. If an administrative action occurs, an insurance producer may be required to report the action to any and all states in which an insurance license is held and in accordance with the timeframes and requirements of each state.

Pursuant to SDCL 58-30-168, you may make a written request to the Division of Insurance within thirty (30) days of the date of this denial for a hearing to determine the reasonableness of this decision to deny your application for licensure.
