RE: Application for Insurance Producer License

Dear Mr. Evans,

This letter is to notify you that your application for licensure as a nonresident insurance producer in South Dakota has been denied. The reason for the denial is as follows:

You submitted an application for an individual nonresident insurance producer license to the South Dakota Division of Insurance ("Division") on August 26, 2019. On your answers to the application questions, you answered "Yes" to having been convicted of a felony. You did not provide the required documentation with you application.

The Division wrote to you on September 11, 2019 via regular mail and email to request a copy of the charging document, a copy of the official document demonstrating the resolution of the charges, or a statement from the court advising the documents are not available. Having failed to receive a response, the Division wrote to you on October 15, 2019 via certified mail, regular mail, and email requesting a response and to provide the requested documentation. To date, the Division has not received a response.

Based on the above information, your application is denied based upon SDCL §§ 58-30-167(1) and (2) for providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete, or materially untrue information in a license application and violating the insurance laws or rules of the State of South Dakota.

Please note that this denial is considered an administrative action which will be reported to the database maintained by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. If an administrative action occurs, an insurance producer may be required to report the action to any and all states in which an insurance license is held and in accordance with the timeframes and requirements of each state.

Pursuant to SDCL § 58-30-168, you may make a written request to the Division of Insurance within thirty (30) days of the date of this denial for a hearing to determine the reasonableness of this decision to deny your application for licensure.
