Re: Application for South Dakota Non-Resident Insurance Producer License

Dear Richard Michael Feary

This letter is to notify you that your application for licensure as a non-resident insurance producer in South Dakota has been denied. The reason for the denial is as follows:

You submitted an application for an individual non-resident insurance producer license to the South Dakota Division of Insurance ("Division") on May 18, 2022. You answered following questions as "YES":

- Question 1A of the licensing application asking if you had ever been convicted of a misdemeanor;
- Question 1B of the licensing application asking if you had ever been convicted of a felony; and
- Question 2 of the licensing application asking if you had ever been named or involved as a party in an administrative proceeding.

You provided documentation showing you were charged with or found guilty of the following offense:

- Battery, Misdemeanor, 2004
- DUI Alcohol/Drugs, Misdemeanor, 2004
- Menacing, Felony, 2015

You also provided documentation showing that you have been the subject of the following administrative actions:

- 2020 Virginia, Revocation
- 2020 Louisiana, Revocation
- 2019 South Dakota, Denial
- 2018 Indiana, Denial
- 2018 Tennessee, Denial

Therefore, your application is denied based upon SDCL 58-30-167(2), (6), and (9) for providing incomplete information in the license application; violating any insurance laws, rules, or order of another state's insurance director; having been convicted of a felony; and for having a insurance license revoked or denied in another state.

Please note that this denial is considered an administrative action which will be reported to the data base maintained by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. If an administrative action occurs, an insurance producer may be required to report the action to any

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and all states in which an insurance license is held and in accordance with the timeframes and requirements of each state.

Pursuant to SDCL 58-30-168, you may make a written request to the Division of Insurance within 30 days of the date of this denial for a hearing to determine the reasonableness of this decision to deny your application for licensure.
