RE: Application for Insurance Producer License

Dear Ms. Tarango,

This letter is to notify you that your application for licensure as a nonresident insurance producer in South Dakota has been denied. The reason for the denial is as follows:

You submitted an application for an individual nonresident insurance producer license to the South Dakota Division of Insurance ("Division") on September 12, 2023. On your answers to the application questions, you answered "Yes" to the question 1B concerning felony convictions and "Yes" to question 2 concerning administrative actions. However, you failed to provide all of the required documentation regarding your criminal convictions. Your provided records show that you were arrested for or found guilty of Felony Conspiracy to Import a Controlled Substance, Marijuana; Importation of a Controlled Substance, Marijuana; Conspiracy to Possess a Controlled Substance with Intent to Distribute, Marijuana; and Possession with Intent to Distribute Controlled Substance, Marijuana. Your documentation additionally shows that your license was denied in the state of Kansas.

Based on the above information, your application is denied because you have been determined not to be in good standing under ARSD 20:06:01:03 and based upon SDCL 58-30-167 (2),(6),(8),&(9); for violating any insurance laws or rules; having been convicted of a felony; using fraudulent, coercive, or dishonest practices, or demonstrating incompetence, untrustworthiness, or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business in this state or elsewhere; and for having an insurance producer license, or its equivalent, denied, suspended, or revoked in any other state

Please note that this denial is considered an administrative action which will be reported to the database maintained by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. If an administrative action occurs, an insurance producer may be required to report the action to any and all states in which an insurance license is held and in accordance with the timeframes and requirements of each state.



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Pursuant to SDCL 58-30-168, you may make a written request to the Division of Insurance within thirty (30) days of the date of this denial for a hearing to determine the reasonableness of this decision to deny your application for licensure.
