RE: Application for Insurance Producer License

Dear Ms. Womack,

This letter is to notify you that your application for licensure as a nonresident insurance producer in South Dakota has been denied. The reason for the denial is as follows:

You submitted an application for an individual non-resident insurance producer license to the South Dakota Division of Insurance ("Division") on August 28, 2023. On your answers to the application questions, you answered "Yes" to the question concerning felony convictions. You provided documentation with your application showing between 2013 to 2019 you have been arrested for and/or convicted of the following:

- Misdemeanor Driving While Intoxicated
- Felony Driving While Intoxicated 3rd or More
- Felony Possession of a Controlled Substance

On your answers to the application questions, you answered "No" to the question concerning administrative actions. However, you were the subject of an administrative action from the State of Florida, where Florida initially denied your application for licensure, due to criminal record/history, later granting a license under stipulation. You later explained that you didn't understand the application question.

Based on the above information, your application is denied based upon SDCL 58-30-167 (1), (2), (6), and (8) by providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete, or materially untrue information in the license application, violating the insurance laws or rules of another state, for having been convicted of a felony, and for using fraudulent, coercive, or dishonest practices, or demonstrating incompetence, untrustworthiness, or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business in this state or elsewhere.

Please note that this denial is considered an administrative action which will be reported to the database maintained by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. If an administrative action occurs, an insurance producer may be required to report the action to any and all states in which an insurance license is held and in accordance with the timeframes and requirements of each state.

Pursuant to SDCL 58-30-168, you may make a written request to the Division of Insurance within 30 days of the date of this denial for a hearing to determine the reasonableness of this decision to deny your application for licensure.
