The Labor Market Information Center (LMIC) is conducting the 2024 South Dakota Small Grains Custom Harvester Survey. This survey is conducted on an annual basis to comply with provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA). The INA requires employers seeking workers for seasonal (temporary) agricultural employment to pay both domestic and foreign workers a wage no lower than the highest of the following wage rates:

- ♦ Adverse Effect Wage Rate (AEWR), released by the U.S. Department of Labor
- ✤ Federal, state or local statutory minimum wage rate
- Prevailing wage rate for the occupation in the area of intended employment

Due to the fact employers must pay seasonal workers the highest of these three wage rates, a prevailing wage rate must be determined. This survey form was sent to your attention because employers who hire seasonal harvest workers are the only source of this information.
