

## Instructions for Finding Per Capita Income in the Virtual Labor Market Data System


Begin at the menu page [https://dlr.sd.gov/lmic/menu\\_income.aspx](https://dlr.sd.gov/lmic/menu_income.aspx). Under the “Income Data” heading, choose the following option:
