



## Labor Force

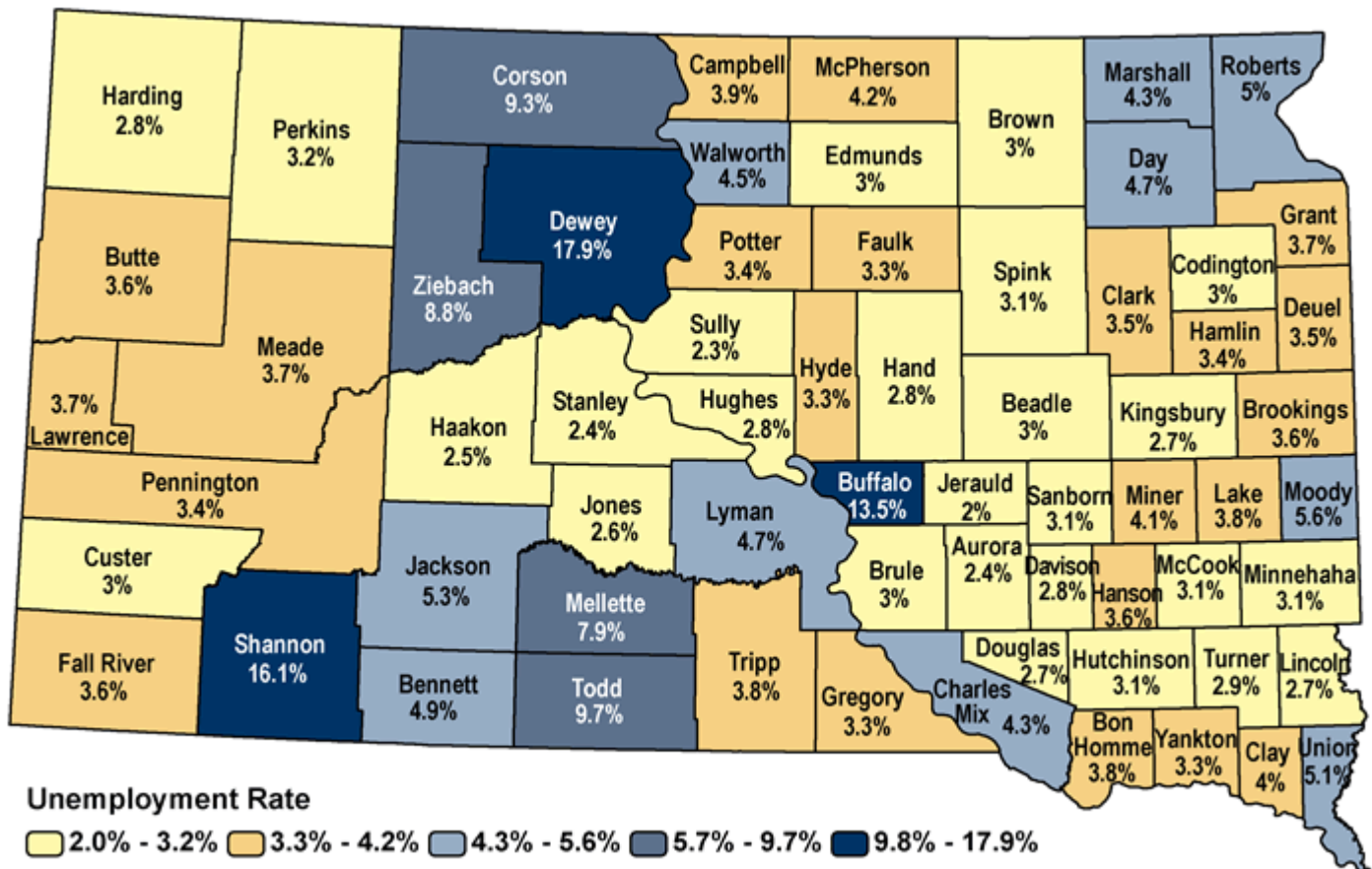

Preliminary estimates show the July 2013 South Dakota labor force down over the month, with the level of employed decreasing by 200 (0.0 percent). The level of unemployed decreased by 300 (1.7 percent). The July unemployment rate was

Nationally, both the number of unemployed persons, at 11.5 million, and the unemployment rate, at 7.4 percent, edged down in July. Over the year, these measures were down by 1.2 million and 0.8 percentage point, respectively.

South Dakota's July 2013 labor force of 449,000 increased compared to the July 2012 level of 445,000. The level of employed increased by 6,600 (1.6 percent); the level of unemployed decreased by 2,600 persons (13.0 percent).

### Notes about labor force data

The unemployment rate represents the number of unemployed as a percent of the labor force. People are classified as unemployed if they do not have jobs, have actively looked for work in the prior four weeks and are currently available for work. People who were not working and were waiting to be recalled to jobs from which they were temporarily laid off are also included as unemployed.

Labor force estimates for South Dakota are produced by the Labor Market Information Center in cooperation with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The concepts and definitions underlying the labor force data come from the Current Population Survey (CPS), the household survey which is the official measure of the labor force for the nation. The statewide estimate of the number of nonfarm jobs is a component of the model used to produce the labor force estimates. Other data used in this model include the number of continued unemployment insurance claims and survey data from the Current Population Survey (CPS) which is specific to the state.

Although state specific data is used in the production of the labor force estimates for South Dakota, the state monthly model estimates are controlled in "real time" to sum to national monthly labor force estimates from the CPS. Therefore, variation in the estimates of the employed and unemployed are somewhat controlled by what is happening nationally.

## **South Dakota Nonfarm Wage & Salaried Workers by Industry**

### **Over-the-month comparisons**

Based on a monthly survey of South Dakota establishments, preliminary estimates show the nonfarm wage and salaried worker level is 426,400 for July, decreasing by 2,800 (0.7 percent) compared to the revised June estimate of 429,200.

There were two sectors that showed the largest increases over the month. Leisure and hospitality had an increase of 1,200 workers (2.4 percent) and trade, transportation and utilities added 900 workers (1.0 percent).

There were many summer events in July that positively impacted business activity in these industries, such as the Black Hills Roundup, Miles of Smiles, Hot Summer Nites, Jazzfest, The Corn Palace Stampede Rodeo, Days of 76, Gold Discovery Days and Storybook Land Festival.

### **Over-the-year comparisons**

The nonfarm wage and salaried worker level increased by 7,300 (1.7 percent) when comparing the July 2012 level of 419,100 to the July 2013 level of 426,400. Industries adding the most workers included retail trade, educational and health services, and leisure and hospitality.

The leisure and hospitality sector added 3,500 workers (7.2 percent), for a total of 51,800 in July 2013, up from the July 2012 level of 48,300.

Retail trade is continuing to trend upward and had an increase of 3,100 workers (6.0 percent) to a level of 54,800 workers in July 2013.

The educational and health services sector added 1,000 workers (1.5 percent) over the year to a level of 67,900 in July 2013 compared to 66,900 in July 2012. Growth in this sector is largely driven by the continued demand for healthcare services.
