What They Do

Maintain highways, municipal and rural roads, airport runways and rights-of-way. Duties include patching broken or eroded pavement, repairing guard rails, highway markers and snow fences. May also mow or clear brush from along road or plow snow from roadway.

Education & Training

The minimum of a high school diploma is recommended for highway maintenance worker positions. Those with postsecondary education in a heavy construction or related program are normally given preference in the hiring process. Work experience helping with street or highway maintenance is also a plus.
