Job Fair Matches STI Students with Healthcare Employers

PIERRE, S.D. – The South Dakota Department of Labor and Regulation (DLR) will be co-hosting the Southeast Technical Institute (STI) medical job fair on Thursday, May 3. Over 25 regional employers with many job openings to fill today and in the future will be in attendance.

In South Dakota, the health care and social assistance industry is projected to have the largest worker growth of all industries at a 10,065 worker gain, or 17.4 percent increase, by 2018. The aging population and advancements in medical care will help ensure continued worker growth within the health care services industry, especially for hospitals.

“This is the 11th year we are co-hosting the medical job fair,” said Greg Johnson, manager of the Sioux Falls DLR office. “It’s a great opportunity for employers to meet face-to-face with well-qualified and knowledgeable Southeast Technical Institute graduates.”

This year’s graduates have completed programs ranging from nuclear medicine technology and licensed practical nursing to health information services and pharmacy technology.

“Employers in the healthcare industry can request meeting rooms in advance to interview job seekers on the spot,” said Johnson. “We’re eager to help facilitate the job matching process for STI grads however we can.”
