Unemployment Claims Filed for Week Ending Oct. 31

PIERRE, S.D. – During the week of Oct. 25-31, a total of 808 initial weekly claims for state unemployment benefits were processed by the Department of Labor and Regulation. This is an increase of 326 claims from the prior week’s total of 482.

A total of \$719,000 was paid out in state benefits, in addition to \$409,000 in Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC), \$327,000 in Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) and \$196,000 in Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) benefits.

The Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund balance was \$119.1 million on Nov. 1.

The latest number of continued state claims is 3,704 for the week ending Oct. 24, a decrease of 835 from the prior week’s total of 4,539. This indicates the number of unemployed workers eligible for and receiving benefits after their initial claim.

Benefits paid since March 16:

- Regular State = \$86.6 million
- FPUC = \$208.1 million
- PUA = \$16.1 million
- PEUC = \$2.5 million

Total = Approximately \$313.3 million
