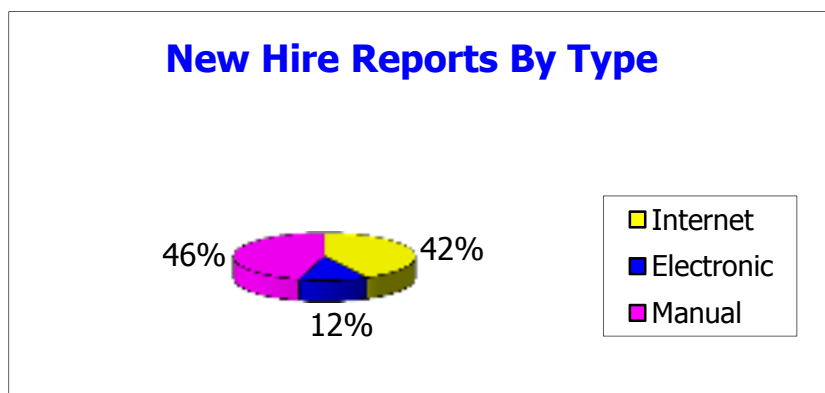

A Federal Bill, Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Act of 1996, was passed and established State New Hire Reporting programs and a National Directory of New Hires. Through the cooperative efforts of the SD Department of Labor, Unemployment Insurance Division and the SD Department of Social Services, Division of Child Support, the SD New Hire Reporting Center was established.

Since its inception, over 2 million new hire reports have been received.

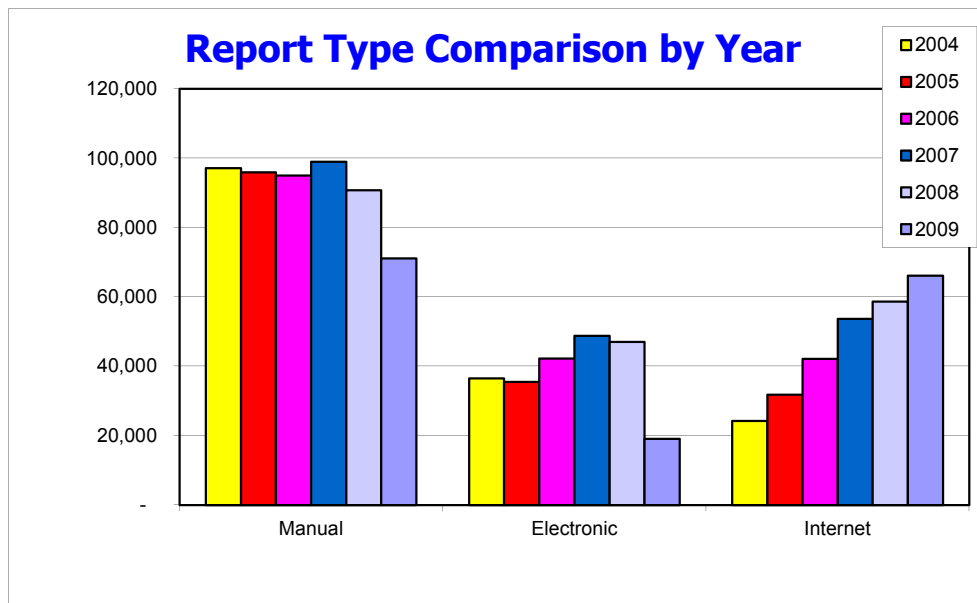
The above chart shows a large decrease in the number of reports from 2007 to 2009. This is a result of an economic slow down and an increase in unemployment levels.
