

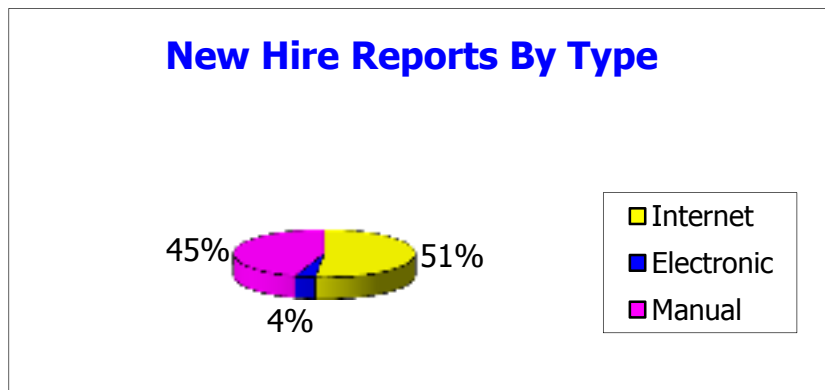

Through the cooperative efforts of the SD Department of Labor, Unemployment Insurance Division and the SD Department of Social Services, Division of Child Support, the SD New Hire Reporting Center was established.

Since its inception over 2 million new hire reports have been received.

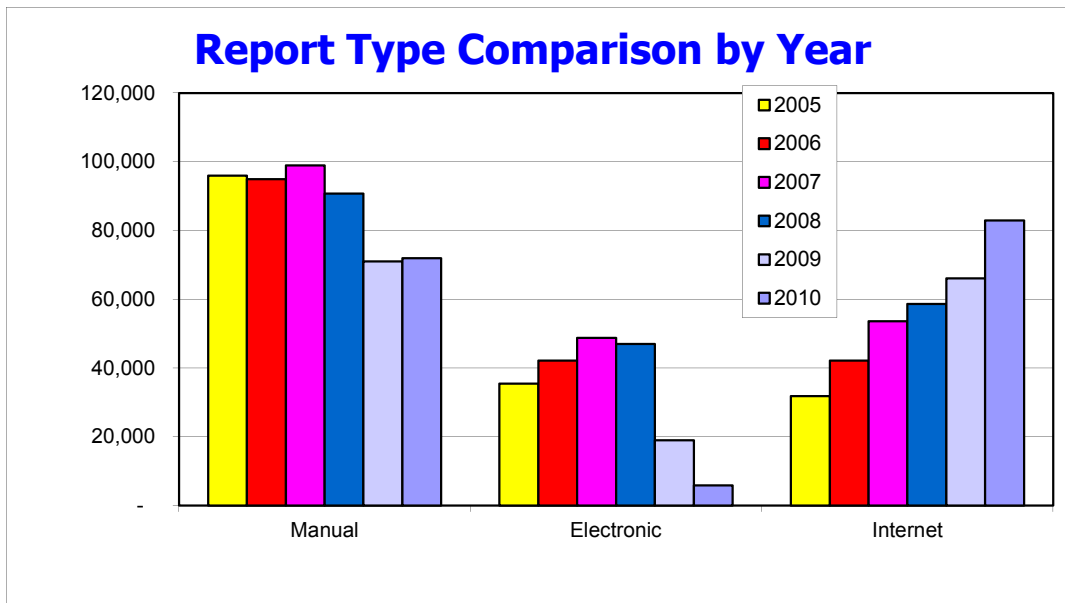
