NATIONAL CAREER READINESS CERTIFICATE

What is the National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC)?

The ACT[®] NCRC is a portable credential that verifies your level of workplace employability skills.

Why are you taking the NCRC assessments?

The NCRC is available to junior and senior students. The goal of earning a certificate is to help you demonstrate your current workplace skills while earning a national credential. You should include this credential in your academic and employment résumés, job applications, and employment portfolio. Additionally, the NCRC can be used for the Advanced Career Endorsement graduation requirements and the Build Dakota scholarship

What assessments must you complete to earn a certificate?

- 1. Applied Math
 - 34 questions
 - Use of calculator and formula sheet allowed
 - Measures skills people use when they apply mathematical reasoning, critical thinking, and problem-solving techniques to work-related problems
- 2. Graphic Literacy
 - 38 questions
 - Measures skills people use when they encounter workplace graphics
- 3. Workplace Documents
 - 35 questions
 - Measures skills people use when they read and apply written text to do a job

What is the format of the test?

- Online
- Multiple choice
- Time allowance of up to 55 minutes perassessment
- Based on situations in the everyday work world—each question features an occupation with a problem to solve related to that occupation
- Questions gradually increase in difficulty

How do you earn a certificate?

- Score at least a Level 3 in each assessment
- Certificate levels are bronze, silver, gold, and platinum
- Certificate level is determined by the lowest score earned across all three assessments (e.g., if you have one silver and two golds in the individual assessments, you will earn a silver certificate)
